Below is this week's government and legislative affairs update. All previous legislative guidance and other affiliate resources are stored via the VillageMD Affiliated Practices COVID-19 Resource Center.

- The House <u>voted</u> to extend Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Flexibility. Borrowers can use the funds for 24 weeks instead of eight weeks and would only require them to spend 60% of the loan expenses on payroll costs instead of 75%. The bill is headed to the Senate where it is expected to pass.
- President Trump <u>announced</u> an Executive Order on Preventing Online Censorship.
- The White House is <u>pushing</u> Congress to ban surprise medical bills outright, without stipulating who pays for these services in the next coronavirus stimulus package.
- The Senate Finance committee will hold their first hearing since the National Emergency was declared: Oversight of the FDA's foreign drug manufacturing services.
- For-profit hospitals <u>asked</u> Congress for reduced interest rates on advanced payments via the Federation of American Hospitals (FAH).
