Below is this week's government and legislative affairs update. All previous legislative guidance and other affiliate resources are stored via the <u>VillageMD Affiliated Practices COVID-19 Resource Center</u>.

- President Trump <u>signed</u> into law Paycheck Protection Program Flexibility Act (PPPFA), in an attempt to address many concerns expressed by the small business community around the Paycheck Protection Program aimed at providing COVID-19 relief.
- Senate Majority Leader McConnell <u>said</u> he expects Senate Republicans will begin considering proposals for a "fourth and final" coronavirus response bill to address the needs of the country "in about a month."
- The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) <u>released</u> start dates for new CMMI models around Direct Contracting. Models will now begin in April 2021.
- Senators Grassley, Wyden, Pallone and Walden <u>asked</u> HHS to speed release of CARES grants to Medicaid providers.
- The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) <u>said</u> extending many of the newly waived restrictions on telehealth beyond the pandemic would require Congressional legislative changes, despite the president's executive order making regulatory waivers permanent.
- CMS said it will withhold some CARES Act funds from states that fail to follow oversight requirements on infection control, after the agency released public data <a href="mailto:showing">showing</a> 26,000 nursing home residents have died of COVID-19.
- HHS <u>signaled</u> additional CARES payments could be coming for some high-impact areas that missed the April 10 application deadline.
